<b>F-3</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Firearm theft,</li> <li>• Perjury,</li> <li>• Robbery,</li> <li>• Bribery,</li> <li>• Involuntary manslaughter, and</li> <li>• Reckless manslaughter</li> </ul>	Nine months to 3 years in prison*	Up to \$10,000 monetary fine	No	Up to three years post-release control (PRC, i.e., parole)	*Some F-3 offenses qualify for 1-5 years in prison
<b>F-4</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Elder abuse or neglect,</li> <li>• Motor vehicle theft,</li> <li>• Felony DUI/OVI, and</li> <li>• Aggravated assault</li> </ul>	Six to 18 months in prison (6 mos. minimum)	Up to \$5,000 monetary fine	Up to five-years community control (probation)	No	No
<b>F-5</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Credit card and check fraud,</li> <li>• Breaking and entering,</li> <li>• Theft over \$1,000,</li> <li>• License plate theft,</li> <li>• Motor vehicle title fraud, and</li> <li>• High-level drug crimes</li> </ul>	Six to 12 months in prison	Up to \$2,500 monetary fine	Up to five-years community control (probation)	No	No
